BAPTISM:

It is mandatory to attend a baptism instruction class before scheduling the date for the baptism. Death, and taxes, and many things in-between terrify us every day of our lives, and now even more in this time of pandemic. All of us live with some degree of anxiety, fatigue, or depression. This can make trusting God very difficult—too much can go wrong! But even those closest to Jesus weren't quick to trust.

In the gospel today, Jesus frightens the apostles with quite an "otherworldly" experience. First, they see Jesus blindingly transformed by light. Then they see Jesus talking with two ancient prophets, Moses and Elijah, who had been dead for over 1000 years! Peter was speechless, and it says "They were terrified."

But Jesus doesn't rush to comfort or reassure them, because he knows that they don't yet see the whole picture—they are terrified only because they do not yet believe they can trust the unknown to God. The answer to all of our stress and worry lies in God's own words today: "This is My Beloved Son—listen to him!"

First, we might have to add "Stop" and "Look." *Stop* the inner chatter, and the outer noise, just for a while. Look, really look with time and focus and attention, at the person talking to you, the task at hand, the cat in your lap. Now, you can *Listen*: Listening is a decision to receive with open hands whatever God is giving you.

Jesus did not explain every detail to the apostles, because he knew that the God of all life was trustworthy—and that is enough, for them, and for us. Yes, we will have fears, because there is evil in the world. But Jesus trusted God with the deepest and most vulnerable places of his heart. If we listen, Jesus will teach us how to trust that way.

X Remember, on **Fridays in Lent** we have added a Mass at 7:30pm followed by Stations of the Cross. Registration is necessary, please call, 201-836-3085 if you plan to attend. Also, we have placed "Five Minutes with the Word for Lent 2021" in the vestibule. Please take one for your use during this holy season.

UP-DATED Directives for Parish Liturgical Celebrations during the Covid 19 Pandemic

The guidelines below, given by Cardinal Tobin, apply to all churches and must be observed without exception.

- 1. Cardinal Tobin continues to dispense the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday & Holy Days.
- 2. In accord with national, state and local health directives, those who show symptoms of COVID-19, who have been exposed to an infected person, or have traveled to unsafe places listed on the CDC.gov website, are not permitted to enter the church for 14 days. *It is recommended that before Mass, everyone should check their temperature at home before coming to Church.*
 - Those who are at risk because of an underlying health issue are strongly encouraged to avoid the risks posed by attendance at public celebrations of the Mass
- 3. Masks must be worn by all individuals while in the church.
- 4. Individuals must maintain social distancing (six feet) between each person while in the church.
- 5. A household may be seated together and not observe social distancing.

A household is defined as those people who have been living together under the same roof in close proximity throughout the quarantine. It does not include relative from other addressed or other extended family.

Note: There still will be a risk for anyone who attends a public Mass. Even with best health practices and strict social distancing, anyone who enters a public space should recognize there is a risk of contracting the coronavirus.

In addition, here at Ascension until further notice, these additional directives must be followed for your safety:

• Reservations will be taken on a first come, first served basis.

You may reserve for daily & Sunday Mass for multiple weeks

- One Mass will be celebrated at <u>8:30am</u> in the Church (Monday-Friday). During Lent will celebrate Mass at 7:30pm on Friday's. Our daily Mass will continue to be Livestreamed via Facebook.
- Saturday morning Mass will be celebrated & Livestreamed at 8:30am in the Church.
- Saturday Evening Mass will be celebrated in the Church at 5:30pm and on Sunday at 7:30am, 9:30am and 11:30am. Only the 5:30pm Mass will be Livestreamed via Facebook.
 - Attendance will be taken and no one will be admitted after Mass begins (doors will be locked).

All Funerals, Weddings, and Baptisms will follow the same protocol.

- -Enter front doors of church-hand sanitizer will be available for your use
- -All visitors, including children, must wear masks, have and use their own wipes.

Please wipe down area you have used and take with you any items you use.

- -Practice social distancing (6 feet apart). We have roped off pews not to be used.
- -You may light candles, please refrain from touching other areas in church.
- -Children must remain with adults at all times
- -Please No gathering or socializing in church or on church property




