### **BAPTISM:**

It is mandatory to attend a baptism instruction class before scheduling the date for the baptism. Baptism is usually celebrated on the third Sunday of each month at 1:00 p.m. Parents must be registered parishioners and must attend pre-Baptism instruction usually given on the first Sunday of every month at 1:00 p.m. in the Gathering Room. # Readings for Sunday July 19, 2020

Wis 12:13, 16-19/Ps 86:5-6, 9-10, 15-16 [5a]/Rom 8:26-27/ Mt 13:24-43 or 13:24-30



In the 1800's, the Victorians had strict rules of etiquette around how and when people could be "received" for visits. There were only certain times of each day that a man or woman would be "receiving." If the butler told you, "Madame is not receiving today," you were politely asked to leave your card, and wait for a reply.

But today, with email, cell phones, and iPads, it seems we're all "receiving" all the time, whether we want to or not! There is starting to be a backlash—many people report exhaustion and terrible pressure from too much contact and "TMI" ("too much information," for those of you who don't text).

According to Jesus, there's no such thing as "TMI" from God! If we're not "receivers" of the seeds God has planted in us, we're not listening to God's voice deep within us; we need help. The uncontrolled talking in our lives can become like background babbling. How quiet is your house? Or your day? We can listen without hearing, but that does not nourish our soul.

Communication is the heart of the Christian community—and Jesus says we desperately need deep communication with God, to grow in love. You know, we are soil, made from the dust of the earth. At times, God's word is the seed that falls on our hard hearts. We shut our ears, either from pride or anger with God, or simply laziness, so the seed can't grow. Or we're too busy and impatient to nurture the seed.

What would enable you to be more receptive to God's presence? And what blocks do you need to remove from your life now, so that you can really hear God again? Listen to God's answers to these questions—so that your seed can really take root.

▶ Just a gentle reminder. Summer is the season for outdoor barbecues, beaches, and, of course, those well-deserved family summer vacations. While families spend hours planning ahead for those 3-day weekends and weeks out of town, they sometimes tend to overlook that their parish needs them even during the summer months. Envelopes are often forgotten.



# **Directives for Re-Opening Churches**

The guidelines below, given by Cardinal Tobin, apply to all churches and must be observed without exception.

- 1. Cardinal Tobin continues to dispense the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday & Holy Days.
- 2. In accord with national, state and local health directives, those who show symptoms of COVID-19 or who have been exposed to an infected person are not permitted to enter the church for 14 days.
- 3. Masks must be worn by all individuals while in the church.
- 4. Individuals must maintain social distancing (six feet) between each person while in the church.

5. A household may be seated together and not observe social distancing.A household is defined as those people who have been living together under the same roof in close proximity throughout the quarantine. It does not include relative from other addressed or other extended family.

Note: There still will be a risk for anyone who attends a public Mass. Even with best health practices and strict social

distancing, anyone who enters a public space should recognize there is a risk of contracting the coronavirus.

In addition, here at Ascension until further notice, these additional directives must be followed for your safety:

# Daily Mass and Week-End Mass Schedule and directives are as follows

- Reservations will be taken on a first come, first served basis. Please call (no email, text, voicemail requests will be taken) the parish office, 201-836-8961 no later than 3:00pm on Friday. (If the office is closed due to Holiday, please call by Thursday).
- Mass will be celebrated at **8:00am** in the Church (Monday-Friday). Mass will also continue to be Livestreamed via Facebook.
  - Attendance will be taken and no one will be admitted after Mass begins (doors will be locked). There is a limited capacity of 80 people.
- Saturday morning Mass will be celebrated & Livestreamed at **8:30am** in the Church.
- Wednesday evening Novena will continue to be Livestreamed only at 7:30pm
- Saturday Evening Mass will be celebrated in the Church at 5:30pm and on Sunday at 7:30am, 9:30am and 11:30am. Only the 5:30pm Mass will be Livestreamed via Facebook.
  - > Attendance will be taken and no one will be admitted after Mass begins (doors will be locked). There is a limited capacity of 80 people.

# All Funerals, Weddings, and Baptisms will follow the same protocol. (80 person capacity)

- -Enter side door near rectory
- -All visitors, including children, must wear masks, have and use their own hand sanitizer and wipes. Please wipe down area you have used and take with you any items you use.
- -Practice social distancing (6 feet apart). We have roped off pews not to be used.
- -You may light candles, please refrain from touching other areas in church.
- -Children must remain with adults at all times
- -Bathrooms will not be open
- -Please No gathering or socializing in church or on church property
