Sunday: 2 Kgs 5:14-17/Ps 98:1-4/2 Tm 2:8-13/Lk 17:11-19



It takes exercising faith to increase its muscles! How much easier it is to jog or work out with a friend? When we're in a faith community together, working out the ways of faith side by side, it's all part of a healthy Christian lifestyle. Even the hard parts of living our faith can feel positive.

Our Catechism of the Catholic Church says, ŏFaith is not an isolated act. No one can believe aloneí You have not given yourself faith as you have not given yourself life. The believer has received faith from others and should hand it on to others...I cannot believe without being carried by the faith of others, and by my faith I help support others in the faith." (par. 166)

One of the most important things Catholics do is to supply faith for each otherô as the Catechism says, õI cannot believe without being carried by the faith of others.ö We should offer to pray for each other frequently, because it comforts us and strengthens the network of faith.

There is no shame in admitting that we need each other; but some of us feel ashamed to talk about our faith, even with another churchgoer. Maybe that is why St. Paul says today, õdonøt be embarrassedí ö. We need to encourage each other in the working out of faith in the decisions of everyday life. And we humans constantly need to remind each other. C. S. Lewis said, "We have to be continually reminded of what we believe. Neither the belief in Christ nor any other will automatically remain alive in the mind. It must be fedí .ö

Reach out to someone who has stopped going to church. Just asking them is an exercise in extending your own faith. Try it and see.

- October is here. It is **Respect Life Month** and the **month of our Blessed Mother**. I call your attention to some excellent opportunities for us as Catholics to honor Mary, the Mother of our God of Life. We pray the Rosary Monday through Saturday at 7:45am in church. During the entire month we will collect donations for a **Baby Shower** for unwed mothers of our area. Our parish "**Giving Crib**", on the right side of the church, will remain in place for the whole month.
- This weekend we welcome Fr. Doroteo (Teo) Layosa, a chaplain at Paramus Catholic High School. He will be in residence here at Ascension, joining our pastoral staff in helping us for certain weekday Masses and for our weekend Masses. He will also help with our Religious Education program and assist with altar server recruitment and training. Let us give Fr. Teo our usual warm welcome to Ascension! We are certainly glad to have him with us.
- On Sunday, October 2nd, a solemn Mass will be celebrated at 3pm in the Cathedral Basilica of the Sacred Heart in Newark to honor the Filipino Martyrs San Lorenzo Ruiz and San Pedro Calungsod.
- On Tuesday, October 4th, we will gather at 4pm in our Blessed Mother¢s courtyard to celebrate our annual **Blessing of Animals** in honor of St. Francis of Assisi. We invite you to bring your pets, large and small, to receive God¢s special blessing.

We have placed a donation box in the vestibule of the church for donations for those animals who are awaiting homes that are in nearby shelters. Donations of money, food, treats, toys, clean towels or blankets, as well as cleaning products would be greatly appreciated. If you are bringing your pet to the blessing, you may bring donation items then as well. New Jersey's Adoption Law has changed

Beginning January 1, 2017, adoptees and certain relatives will be able to obtain a copy of their original birth certificate without a court order. The birth certificate will include the names of the birth parents who placed children for adoption unless a birth parent requests their name be omitted.

Birth parents who wish to preserve their privacy must submit a *Redaction Request Form* to the New Jersey Department of Health no later than **December 31, 2016**. The *Redaction Request Form* can be obtained by calling 866-649-8726, ext. 582 or downloading it at http://nj.gov/health/forms/reg-36c.pdf.

The Catholic Church has always supported reunions between adoptees and birth parents, if such reunions were by mutual consent. The Church continues to do so through their Catholic Charities agencies.
